

Payment Info

GotSport ('GotPay')

As of the Spring 2025 season, NSC will pay referees directly from the GotSport to your bank account of choice, using the "GotPay" function.

You will receive further information ahead of the season on setting up your account/filling out information in order to receive payment via this method.

This should be a one time process, unless you wish to change your banking information and direct payment elsewhere in future



Referee Weekly Checklist

Monday - Thursday 9am Each Week

- Review your own schedule for the upcoming weekend for availability to referee
- Submit the game request form

Thursday Each Week

- Check your emails and GotSport account for assignments for the coming weekend
- You must accept the game in GotSport by Thursday
 10pm Any game not accepted MAY be reassigned.
- Notify <u>admin@needhamsoccer.com</u> as soon as possible if you are unable to accept a game.

Saturday / Sunday Each Week

- Double check your assignments time & location
- In case of bad weather, check NSC latest Field Status
- Arrive 15 minutes before kick off
- REFEREE THE GAME!
- Report scores




Requesting Assignments

Each week during the season, you will need to let the ref assignor know your availability and which times you are able to referee and would like to be considered for.

Submit by Thursday 9am each week

TIP: Be as flexible as possible with your times being submitted. If you only submit 1 time it will likely be harder for the assignor to give you a game than if you give multiple options



Accepting Game Assignments

1. You should receive an email similar to below for each individual game you are assigned. The email will include game information such as day/time, field, and teams.




VERY IMPORTANT

You then need to accept the assignment in your GotSport Account by 10pm Thursday

Games not accepted, MAY be reassigned

2. Login at https://system.gotsport.com or CLICK HERE TO LOGIN

Login: this is the account with which you were signed up as a referee. In most cases this will be your parent account with you as a 'profile' on their account.



If you are on your parent's account you first need to navigate to your profile

Hit the "Family" link and select your profile on the next screen.


Best Practice: Even if you don't receive an email as above, login to double check for any assignments in case your spam filters blocked the email



Accepting Game Assignments



4. Scroll to see your assigned games. For each game select "assign".



5. Hit "Accept" - The status will change to "Accepted"







Accepting Game Assignments

Rejecting A Game

- If your availability has changed and you are unable to accept the assigned game, click the "Decline" button instead.
- If you have previously accepted a game, and something changes you must email the ref assignor admin@needhamsoccer.com
- Last minute withdrawals after you have previously indicated availability are
 frowned upon and can leave games uncovered, or even means other referees
 that could have had the game miss out. If your plans or schedule changes,
 please notify the ref assignor with as much notice as possible. Late
 withdrawals may impact your game assignments in future.

If you reject a game, or you become unavailable after accepting you MUST send an email to admin@needhamsoccer.com with as much notice as possible



Post-Game Score Reports


Part of your job as referee is to report the score of the game to the league.

If you do not report the score, the game remains "incomplete" on the system, and you cannot be paid!

To Report The Score:

1. The score reporting link can be found on the NSCCL Referee section @ needhamsoccer.com or click the image to the right to go directly there.





3. Input the 'Event Pin'

Event Pin: <u>Current Year</u> (e.g. 2022)


Scores must be reported by Sunday night each week. Failure to report scores may impact game assignments in future!

TIP: Bookmark the current season's score reporting link on your cell phone's home screen so you can access immediately at the end of your game.



Post-Game Score Reports

4. Enter the 'Match Number' to bring up the game details (double check that it is the correct game/teams. The match number will be included in your GotSport account / assignment email.



5. Enter the score for each team and hit Save.

That's it! Your game assignment is complete. Repeat for each individual game you referee.

Scores must be reported by Sunday night each week. Failure to report scores may impact game assignments in future!

TIP: Bookmark the current season's score reporting link on your cell phone's home screen so you can access immediately at the end of your game.



NSCCL Rules

Our NSCCL program follows the BAYS league game rules.

Rules of Note To Be Aware Of For All Games:

- All games 2 halves of 30 minutes, 5 minute half time
- Substitutions can be made on any stoppage for either team
- Shin guards must be worn by all players at all times
- No deliberate heading indirect free kick

7v7 (3rd / 4th Grade) Games

- No offsides
- Goalkeepers may NOT punt the ball over half. If the balls travels over the halfway line without bouncing, an indirect free kick is awarded on the halfway line.
- When the ball go out of bounds for a goal kick, opponents must retreat to their own half until the kick is taken. This applies only when the ball has gone out of play, not from the goalkeepers hands.

9v9 (5th / 6th Grade) Games

- Offsides in effect
- Above 7v7 specific modifications do NOT apply to 9v9





Zero Tolerance Reporting

Please Report Any Incidents!

While refereeing can be a great and rewarding experience, unfortunately on occasions incidents can occur where players, coaches or spectators get caught up in the moment, vent frustrations or disagree with a decision you make on the field and let you know about it!

Needham Soccer Club operate a strict *Zero Tolerance Policy* for coaches and spectators, while players may only ask questions or respectfully address the referee during the game.

What is Zero Tolerance?

In short, coaches and spectators are not permitted to debate, appeal, complain, argue or otherwise question the referees authority and any decisions you make or do not make in the game. The laws of the game are applied based on the viewpoint and opinion of the referee only, and coaches/spectators in our programs are expected to allow the referee to do their job.

The only interactions coaches should have with the referee is to greet you at the start, thank you at the end. They may ask you questions or clarify certain things ahead of the game.

Spectators are also expected to leave referees to call the game as they see fit.

How To Deal With Violations

In The Moment

- Try to remain calm and in control of the game. Continue to make decisions confidently and assertively and try not to let any outside influence impact your decisions.
- If you feel comfortable doing so, remind coaches about Zero Tolerance. All coaches should be aware of the rules, so "Coach, Zero Tolerance" should be enough to remind them.
- If spectators are causing an issue, the coaches are also responsible. Feel free to address with coaches if you feel comfortable doing so.

After The Game - Please Report Incidents

In order to hold our coaches and spectators accountable please use the form on the link below to report any incidents at your games. We can only address issues if we are aware, so please be sure to submit the form if you feel that any coaches/spectators have violated this policy.

Bad Weather

Always Check Latest Field Status At <u>www.needhamsoccer.com</u> for latest field status.

If the field on which your game is going to be closed at game time, your game is cancelled.

Click Here For Field Status

<u>TIP:</u> Field Status can change throughout the day. So be sure to check back closer to kick off time for latest Status.

If your field is open, but your field has standing water or puddling on the field, then as referees you should work with the coaches to cancel the game and let the ref assignor know it was cancelled.

Additional Referee Events

Fall - NSCCL Jamboree

During the Fall season, in addition to regular season games, we also host the annual NSCCL lamboree.

Each NSCCL team participates and player 2 shortened games (half of a regular game), with all games played on the turf at Defazio throughout the day and under the lights in the evening. Each game has a paid referee, paid at 50% of the normal rate, but often with opportunity to pick up multiple games

Spring - NSCCL Playoffs

End of season playoff tournament for all NSCCL games, in a knockout single elimination format. All games must be decided on the day with no replays, so some games finish with a shootout if tied!

Spring - NSCJA 7v7 2nd Grade Jamboree

Our 1st and 2nd Grade Junior Academy (NSCJA) program involves 4v4 games with no referees. However in the Spring we host a 7v7 jamboree for 2nd grade teams to get a taste of 7v7 action, and referees are used for each game.

More information will be provided to referees ahead of each of these events.





Moving To BAYS Travel Refereeing

Refereeing in our 'in-town' NSCCL program can be just the first step for you as a paid referee!

Referees age 14 or older are eligible to take official certification via MassRef (the State referee association), meaning once certified you can referee BAYS Travel league games. We are always looking to grow our ref pool, so encourage interested refs to consider getting their certification

- All game assignments still here in Needham
- Experience different types of refereeing (Center Ref and Assistant Ref positions available for 7v7, 9v9 and 11v11
